Abstract

A family is the bedrock of every given society such as Nigeria. A family is the coming together of two opposite sex individuals to make a union. The coming together will bear fruit such that the children will be produced from such union. The family will be saddled with the responsibility of training, directing, guiding and providing for the children who will grow into adulthood. The children will start their own family life hence the society is formed from the different unions created by the family. Getting it right from the family will amount to a better society. The socio-economic woes of Nigeria can be corrected if we go back to the family and get it right. A healthy family is a family that produced healthy or sound children who will feed the society with sound, and good, progressive and productive ideas that will encourage sound living in the given society like Nigeria. The dearth of morals in our society today is a function of the decline in the trainings in our various families. One cannot rule out environmental, influences and socio-economic influence in Nigeria. One can imagine a well trained child being faced with hunger, insecurity etc, how the child will cope with such moral burden to remain sound in the face of obvious treat to its existence as a human being. Introduction

Nigeria has been described as the most populous country in Africa and third country third country in the world with an estimated population of 120 million people and having 252 officially documented languages and dialects. In Africa, Nigeria is mostly endured with abundant mineral resources to feed the whole continent and also known for the fertile soil which is a land flowing with milk and honey.

Despite the level of education in Nigeria. It is obvious that women are the ones at the disadvantage in many Nigerian families.

A healthy family values is a fusion of Christian values and traditional values which are not in conflict. Nigerian family display community ownership. It is silent in support of either monogamy or polygamy as a system rather welcome a child despite how the child comes to the family. It supports healthy social relationship among family members. Nigeria families do not play with gift of a child especially male children contributes to the family lineage and the name of the family will not go into extinction. The celebration of fertility is another important aspect of the family life especially among Igbo people of Nigeria but narrowed the Mbaise people. Power more to

relationship and assertion of authority is mostly placed on the male members of the family.

The basic values such as respect, responsibility, self-control, honesty, compassion, thankfulness, perseverance, humility, loyalty and faith in God should be made our second nature. Also, we should not loose sight of values such as moderation, integrity, kindness, contentment, patience, peace and commitment are major values to give attention to.

In the family, we spend much time together such as have fun, play games, share experiences, just like an ideal and real family should be.

Are most values seen in the culture and tradition of Mbaise People? What is the culture and tradition of Mbaise? As regards to the family, Mbaise women are celebrated for their fertility. To be an Mbaise women, in their culture of Igbu-ewu, a woman must bear at least 10 children; some women have given birth to as many as 15. Mbaise culture is rich in music and Igbo dance. Music is played on the wood xylophone, hand prior. Long short and slit drums past, gongs, bamboo horn and calabash.

Christian family values are not in conflict with African or traditional family values rather experience some variation in implementation of some concepts such as life/ownership, community polygamy, monogamy. Family relations that nuclear or extended family system, and value of children, Igbuewu ukwu ceremony, economic and political relationship. Issues of note will include that a court has ruled that female members of the family now can inherit from their father's property.

A central element of being a family is interdependence. All are needed and valued and each person is important to the entire body or important to the whole. Each member of the body shares the joys, sufferings of the other and each depends upon everyone else.

We demonstrate our value of the family through sharing things with the needy as seen in Acts 4:32; All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of his possessions was his own but they shared everything they had.

I Corinthians 12:12-13 The body is a wire, though it is made one body. So it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one spirit into one body.

I Corinthians 12:24-26, But God has combined the members of the body so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it, if one part is honoured, every part rejoices with it. We need to celebrate the success of others in our family. Always say something encouraging to your family members such as "Well done". The need to look out for one another in the family. We also need to help those who are in need. We as family members should help those who are hurt physically or emotionally. We are advised to keep the family need and not to drop or litter in the family which the importance of sanitation. We should also learn to support charity work in our various family groups.

In the family, forgiveness is a major Christian value. We must explore the Christian value of forgiveness. Forgiveness is fundamentally the second nature of God. Forgiveness is the character of God. Throughout the Bible God is described as slow in anger, abounding in love and forgiving sin according to Numbers 14:18.

Matthew 18:21 tells us clearly about the positive aspect of Christ in the Christian value of forgiveness. Jesus was clear in his

command to forgive. Jesus said forgive seventy times seven, in other words, forgive and keep on forgiving without limit. Forgiveness was at the heart of everything Jesus did and is at the heart of the Lord's Prayer. When Jesus declared a person's sins to be forgiven, it most times arouse the anger of those who were not ready to forgive. Yet a prayer for the forgiveness of his persecutors was on Jesus lips as he died.

The cultural values of the Mbaise people can also be seen in the area of music through various native songs such as Ogele, agborogwu, etc.

Emphasis has always been put on male members of the family more because of their rights to both family inheritance and extension of family lineage and name. Social norms are embedded in the family system and such social norms are passed down from one generation to another.

In Nigeria, the family is extremely important, families are not the epitome of destruction but their exists family bond which is mostly described in the saying that blood is thicker than water. Family is fuelled by strong social traditional norms, community life is well established in Nigeria. This has become a very major and common norm in Nigeria because the task of training and looking after a child in Nigeria is more of a community work rather than a family or individual responsibility.

A common knowledge about Mbaise People is the love for children, families can go to any length to have children, the area they can go

to have children include visits to divination, shrines, white garment preachers, even the practice of polygamy. Your educational status does not matter just because of the bid to have children or in some cases male children. Polygamy is wearing out but illicit extra-marital affairs amongst the so called proclaimed monogamous people of the society is still a common sight.

A common value are seen in act of celebration such as flamboyant parties thrown to the family such as naming traditional ceremonies, and Christian marriages, funerals ceremony, celebration of fertility in Igbo land especially in Mbasie area usually called Igbuewu-ukwu etc. Obligations such as marriages, meetings, naming ceremonies, chieftaincies titles, funerals, birthdays are made flamboyantly made in Mbasie. In the family norms as strongly adhered to in Mbasie areas. The women either as a daughter or sister has more value, authority and even in many cases right to inheritance. Immediately she marries, she is treated as one of the possessions of the husband, voiceless, without rights, with constrained freedom and without her own identity. The women has to drop her father's name and take up the husbands name. the woman becomes the wife who is left to do the house chores, against her position in her fathers house, still go to paid job and as well fulfil her sexual role in the family.

Nigerian women are considered subordinate to men, considered as second place to men. Men are still dominant in private and public life. The ideology that men are naturally superior to women in essence and in all area affects the modern day origination of social structures. The ideology prolongs the attitude of negative decimation against women.

Conceptual Framework

Customs and Traditions: These include the acceptable societal values, honesty, respect, morals team work, hard work etc.

According to Obicheta et al, (7.1).

These are acceptable societal behaviours like honesty, respect, hard work, morals, team work, tolerance, patriotism etc.

Theoretical Framework

Functionalist Theory

"Functionalism first emerged in 19th century Europe. The Ferchs sociologist emile Durkheim (1856) was the most influential of the early functionalist, American sociologists such as Talcott Parsons developed the theory in the 20th century and it became the dominant theoretical perspective in sociology during the 1940sand 1950s, particularly in the USA". Iherue (2019p, 179).

Though the theory experienced some decline for obvious negative criticism with competing perspectives which tenders higher explanation and also adopts change of fashion in the evolving world of reason. It has more of biological comparison on how human body works. It may start with examination of the various part of the body such as the heart, brain, lungs and liver. In isolation of various parts may not give a vivid explanation of how life was maintained. The various parts, must be examined in relation to each other, hence the work hand in hand to maintain the organism.

Functionalism agrees with a similar perspective and approach. The different parts of society are seen to be interrelated and taken together to make a whole system. To understand or approach any part of society such as religion or family, the various groups must be seen in relation to society as a whole or complete entity.

"Thus where a biologist will examine a part of the body such as the heart, in terms of its contribution to the maintenance of the human organism, the functionalist will examine a point of society, such as the family, interims of its contribution to the maintenance of the social system Iherue (2019p 180)".

Values provide general guidelines for behavior and worldview of a people that bring together the overall beliefs about what is right or wrong. It articulates what is good or bad desirable or undesirable in a given society.

Healthy Family Approach

A healthy family is that family that produces children with the fear of God and with standard beliefs principles, attitudes and norms which are acceptable to society and society expects to guide the conduct of its members at all times.

Recommendations
